La domesticación is the first chapter of *Bekristen / Cristianos*, a trilogy that stems from a project initiated in 2016 that reflects on compassion as human necessity, social trauma and collective failure.

In *La domesticación* some bodies compete to attain the model that will save them from their own body: from hunger, fear, memory and disease. Bodies convinced that they must be “plausible” and blend with the international style at the cost of suffering the most current of tragedies: the awareness of being involved in a daily life based on

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actions that are destroying the world.

Luz Arcas, a ballet dancer and choreographer from Malaga, founded the company La Fármaco in 2009. She is the winner of the 2015 Award El Ojo Crítico de Danza, the 2015 Lorca Award for Best Female Dance Performer, and finalist of the 2017 Max Award for Best Female Dance Performer, 2009 Injuve Award and 2009 Málaga Crea Award.



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
