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Pauline Viardot was one of the best and most influential singers of her time, and also one of the most important composers of the 19th century. Brahms, Saint-Saëns, Schumann and Fauré composed music for her. Daughter of Manuel Garcia, a tenor, composer and pedagogue from Seville, she possessed a dramatic charm which enchanted Turgenev and delighted Dickens. *Cendrillon (Cinderella)* is an exceptional point of entry into the work of a fascinating woman.

Cendrillon laments her poverty and wonders if she will ever find love. The prince, disguised for the purpose of meeting the young women who inhabit the house, invites the whole family to a ball at the palace. The father repudiates Cendrillon and goes to the ball accompanied by his two other daughters. Cendrillon falls asleep, but is awoken by a Fairy Godmother, who magically dresses her and sends her off to the ball in a carriage with just one condition: she must be back at midnight.

The Teatro Real not only brings music closer to the younger generations, but also offers opportunities to young artists through Opera Estudio, an initiative of the pedagogical project Real Junior, with which it has produced Cendrillon and the magic of a journey through music to unimaginable places and situations.
