[The Wedding of Luis Alonso]

The merger of two works with a curious history. Such was the success of El baile de Luis Alonso that the librettist and the composer decided to write La boda, set some time before El baile. Although Luis Alonso was already married in El baile, in La boda he is in his 50s and is about to marry María Jesús, a beautiful young woman who is much younger than him. In both pieces, the story of the main character, a dancemaster, and his vicissitudes are the best excuse to produce a brilliant and colourful tribute to Cádiz, its atmosphere, songs, types of characters and Carnival... Gerónimo Giménez, a skilful and talented composer, wrote novel, spontaneous and very personal music. Both zarzuelas are part of popular memory, in particular due to their interludes.
